Enclosed herewith, pursuant to our conversation on Friday January 7, 2005, please find a draft of proposed Local Law No. One of the year 2005 for the Town Board relative to the Senior Citizen exemption from real property taxes.

The Town Board must establish a date and time for a public hearing on this Local Law before it passes this Local Law. Notification of that public hearing must be published in the town's official newspaper as required by law and the entire Local Law must be published in that legal notice. You must also obtain an Affidavit of Publication from the newspaper reflecting publication of the legal notice of the public hearing.

Then go ahead and have your meeting. If there are no changes to be made in the Local Law, then the Town Board may go ahead and enact the Local Law. If anything, however, changes in terms of the Local Law as a result of public hearing, so that the Local Law which is adopted is in any way different from that which was published in the town's official newspaper, then you must go back through the entire process all over again with a new public hearing, etc.

Assuming that the Town Board goes ahead and after a proper public hearing is had, adopts Local Law No. One of the year 2005, please have Tess furnish to me the Local Law with the properly completed certification form for filing with the Secretary of State. Have Tess furnish three copies of same to my office. Upon my receipt of same, together with the Affidavit of Publication which you should also have forwarded to me, I will undertake my review of all proceedings and assuming that they meet with legal requirements, I too will sign the certification where indicated and forward same to the Secretary of State's Office for filing.
